Senior Citizen Lunch critique and notes.

1. We need to know what's going on and coordinate our efforts. I was serving 2% milk and people were asking for butter milk, and non fat milk, and all I had was low fat. I didn't know all that was available.
2. We need to speed up the service. The bottleneck is the serving window. Only three people can work the window. Can we assemble plates of food away from the window and place the trays on carts to be rolled out?
3. We need communication with the servers. They were weighing the meat till advised not to.
4. If we do not weigh the meat (we should just eyeball the serving) be sure we have more than enough ready to go. This year we had 78(?) pounds of meat and we nearly ran out. (6.24 ounces per person)
5. Ray organized the buying and cooking and did a fine job, but in the future he should be instructed to purchase 8 ounces per person. Between the seniors and the eaters outside, it will be used.
6. \$100 worth of candy bars was too much candy. But better too much than too little, and the excess will be distributed with lunch in the future. I don't want to sell it. (It only cost \$2 per bag.) Let's give everyone a peppermint patty with lunch for the next two or three meetings.
7. Albertson's printing press was broken and none of the stores had gift certificates. No biggy, Safeway had certificates. Safeway is a higher priced store, some would say, and I will recommend Albertsons or Rite Aid in the future.
