

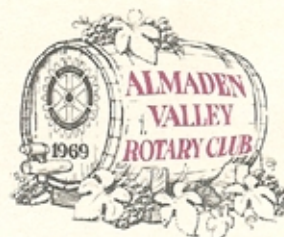

## PIONEER HIGH SCHOOL INTERACT CLUB

The Pioneer High School Interact Club met last Thursday and the students discussed several projects which will ultimately benefit the poor and needy families of our community. They have again decided to participate in the Christmas Tree Decorating Contest at the City Plaza Park which is to be covered by KNTV on Saturday, December 12. Last year, their tree took first prize which won the Interact Club \$400. They, in turn, purchased canned foods with their winnings and along with other donations of food they collected, enabled them to provide many food baskets for the needy during the Holidays. This year, they will set up and man 10 food collection barrels throughout Pioneer High School and are going to give out a raffle ticket to each student who brings canned foods. A drawing will then be held for assorted prizes which they are soliciting from local merchants (i.e. pizzas, tickets to movies, clothing, gift certificates, etc.). ## CORRECTION OF LAST WEEK'S LPGA EDITORIAL

Last week, I stated amounts of contributions which would be donated to the various charitable organizations and retentions by Almaden Valley Rotary Club relative to the LPGA Food and Beverage Concessions project which were incorrect.

For the corrected records: Funds to be distributed to charitable organizations who provided labor assistance will be a total of approximately \$13,000 (subject to final accounting), which, when divided by their 1,678 total hours, equals \$7.80/hour. Almaden Valley Rotary will

receive approximately \$6,950, from which \$2,500 will be set aside for an emergency resource fund and will be capped at \$10,000 (\$2,500/yr. over 4 years) to guarantee the required "front monies" in order to participate in the LPGA Food and Beverage Concessions program. The balance of approximately \$4,450 is to be distributed to various needy organizations in our community as recommended by the Scholarship and Awards Committee and approved by the Board of Directors. So, it appears that approximately \$17,550 will to be donated to local charitable causes due to our participation in the LPGA. That's what makes it all worthwhile .... Thanks to all who helped make it possible!
