

SHRINE CLASSIC

Last Friday's meeting, a joint meeting with the Cambrian Park and Campbell clubs, centered around the then upcoming East-West Shrine Football Classic at Stanford Stadium. This college All-Star game is in its 63rd year. Lloyd Lott, Cambrian Park Rotarian, is also a Shriner and serves on the Game Staff as business manager. It was thanks to Lloyd that we were able to enjoy a presentation by two of the West coaches: Jim Sochor, head coach of the UC Davis Aggies and Don James, head coach of the Washington Huskies. West coach Claude Gilbert from San Jose State was not able to attend.

JIM SOCHOR

Jim Sochor, Head Coach for the UC Davis Aggies, is assistant coach for the West team. Jim replaces John Cooper who withdrew after being named head coach at Ohio State. Jim is the country's winningest active coach in Division II football. In 18 years at UC Davis, Sochor has compiled an overall record of 150-37-4, for a winning percentage of .786.

Sochor's teams have won 17 straight conference championships, an NCAA record. They have made the NCAA playoffs in seven of the last 11 years and five of the past six seasons. The Aggies best finish was second place in 1982. They have won 73 of their last 74 games in Far Western Conference play.

A graduate of San Francisco State University, where he quarterbacked the Gators to three consecutive conference titles, Sochor was an assistant coach at the 1984 Shrine Game.

DON JAMES

West Head Coach Don James is one of the most successful and highly respected coaches in the country. The owner of a 108-43-2 record in 13 years at Washington, he has directed the Huskies to nine straight post-season bowl appearances, including three Rose Bowls.

This year, Washington finished the regular season at 6-4-1 and went on t defeat Tulane 24-12 in the Independence Bowl.

James' Huskies won Pacific-10 Conference championships in 1977, '80 and '81. His teams are 2-1 in the Rose Bowl, defeating Michigan 27-20 in 1978 and lowa 28-0 in '82, and losing to Michigan 23-6 in '81.

Four of his last six teams have been ranked No. 1 in the country at some point in the season. His 1984 team finished the season at No. 2, compiling an 11-1 record and defeating Oklahoma 28-17 in the Orange Bowl. James has been honored by his peers and the media many times, winning national Coach of the Year honors in 1977 (American Football Coaches Association and UPI) and 1984 (Columbus Touchdown Club and Miami Herald).
