The masonry wall was completed on Sunday, May 21, with **Bob Bloomfield** of Bloomfield Custom Masonry providing his expertise and leadership for our Rotarians, **Rich Flynn**, **Roger Bier** and **Ed Lacina**.

The balance of the project was completed on Saturday, June 3, filling the planter with 14 cubic yards of planter mix and the planting of petunias, marigolds and dwarf geraniums. A new plaque and a 16" high wrought iron fence are to be installed this week.
